### Scholarship Criteria

(8-9 pages worth of scholarships and their criteria)

#### 1st Community Credit Union

Open to a graduating senior who is a member in good standing at 1<sup>st</sup> CCU. Student must have a minimum 2.5 GPA and will be attending an accredited two or four-year college in the fall. An additional essay on "How Can a Credit Union Help You Achieve Financial Well Being" is required.

#### American Legion Auxiliary (separate local scholarship application)

Open to a graduating senior who will be attending an accredited college, university, or technical school. Preference will be given to an applicant that is a child, grandchild, niece, or nephew of an American Legion, Sons of an American Legion, Auxiliary member, or attended Badger Girls' State or Badger Boys' State. An additional essay is required expressing why the student believes he/she should receive the scholarship. Letter of recommendation required. This is not the same scholarship as the American Legion Post 100 Scholarship.

#### <u>American Legion Post 100 Scholarship</u> (separate local scholarship application) Open to any graduating senior. Please attach a letter about yourself and a reason for needing

this scholarship. This is <u>not</u> the same scholarship as the American Legion Auxiliary Scholarship.

#### Barbershoppers Scholarship

Open to a graduating senior who will be attending an accredited post-secondary school. Preference will be given for student involvement in chorus or band.

#### Janelle Britton Memorial Scholarship

Available to a graduating senior who is attending a 2 or 4-year college and majoring in the education field. A minimum 2.0 GPA is required. If able, please provide documentation of your education program enrollment from your college or university.

#### Dr. Jack D. Brown Student Athlete Memorial Scholarship

Available to any senior who has earned at least a 2.5 cumulative GPA and been involved in athletics. Two scholarships will be awarded (one female, one male). Must be planning to attend an accredited post-secondary institution (includes one, two, or four-year degree) pursuing any health-related major. Letter of recommendation required.

#### Cataract Sportsman Scholarship

Senior student must be pursuing an Associate or Bachelor Degree at an accredited two or fouryear college/university. Preference will be given to students entering a field of study that relates to the environment, such as agriculture, biology, conservation, and other related fields. A minimum 3.0 GPA is required. Letter of recommendation required.

# Sparta Scholarship Application

- Read the instruction page (on scholarship site)
- Make sure that you are eligible for each scholarship → check criteria page
- Some scholarships have additional components (essay, letter of rec, transcript, etc.)
- Make sure to include your personal statement
- Sign the application form
- Deadline: Friday, February 23<sup>rd</sup> at 7:40am

### More Local Scholarships

- Separate application required → these scholarships do NOT use the SHS application
  - Noted as "Separate local scholarship application" on criteria pages
  - These scholarships use their own application
  - Updated weekly on the Spartan webpage
- May need an essay and letters of recommendation along with their application
- Due dates vary by scholarship
- Many will also be due to Student Services by February 23<sup>rd</sup>
- Check the listing often!

## National or College Scholarships

- National scholarships
  - Websites listed on school district website
  - Fastweb.com, scholarships.com, etc.
  - Make sure the site is reputable never give out your personal information!
- College or University Scholarships
  - Available on their website through financial aid office or alumni relations office
  - Early due dates (apply now!)

# Tips for Receiving a Scholarship

- Apply for as many scholarships as you are eligible
- Follow the directions
- Make sure to turn it in at the correct place
- Meet the deadline
- If possible, type it
  - All applications will be compatible with Notability
- Proofread it. Have someone else proofread it.
- Get your letters of recommendation ahead of time (ask 2-3 weeks prior to deadline)
- MAKE SURE YOUR APPLICATION(S) PACKET IS COMPLETE
- DON'T WAIT UNTIL THE LAST MINUTE

## Other information...

- Some of the scholarships sound similar but are different and have different applications
  - American Legion Auxiliary & American Legion Post 100 → Two different scholarships with different applications
- The "Snowmobiles of Monroe County" and "Western Saddle Club" applications need to be mailed to the providers
  - Address listed under the scholarship's criteria
- The VFW Post 2112 application requires a signature from your school counselor
- Make sure to include a personal statement when applying for scholarships that use the SHS application (prompt on first page)
- Use a staple to secure document, not a paperclip
- New this year: You must submit a checklist of every scholarship you are applying for, regardless of format (different from the cover page you'll submit with your application packets)
- If you have questions....ASK

# Submitting Applications

Completed & organized application packets are due to the Student Services Office by 7:40am on Friday, February 23<sup>rd</sup>

Can submit sooner if you get everything completed

If you're going to be gone that day, applications need to be turned in early
