#### Key Concepts of Period 1 (1491-1607)

- 1. As native populations migrated and settled across the vast expanse of North America over time, they developed distinct and increasingly complex societies by adapting to and transforming their diverse environments.
- 2. Contact among Europeans, Native Americans, and Africans resulted in the Columbian Exchange and significant social, cultural and political changes on both sides of the Atlantic Ocean.

## **Native American Peoples**

- 2. Give the 4-5 or more basic *identifying* characteristics of Native Americans who lived in each of the following groups/regions. Identifying characteristics are those which are specific to that group and not other groups. Generalizations like "they were huntergatherers" are not identifying. Specific hunting or gathering methods, or prey, unique to that group, would be. In your answers, consider all of the aspects that make up human culture.
  - a. Mexico & American Southwest
  - b. American Great Plains
  - c. Mississippi Valley / Mound Builders
  - d. Atlantic Coast / Eastern Woodland
  - e. Pacific Northwest
- 3. Explain why it is very difficult to place Native American nations onto a map of North America.

- 4. List several impactful plants and animals that European explorers brought with them that were new to the New World:
- 5. List several impactful plants and animals new to Europe that European explorers brought back from the New World:
- 6. Describe 3 positive effects of the Columbian Exchange on native peoples.

## To help you understand the reading:

Usually in US History at some point you're given the list of all the "things we got from the Native Americans": birch bark canoes, various uses of buffalo, the three sisters corn, beans & squash, etc. Axtell comes at the contributions of Native Americans to "America" from the other direction, asking the question "How would our development have been different had the explorers arrived on a new continent with no human inhabitants?" In so doing he finds a much deeper contribution.

The first 2 pages or so are a bit of a slog. Please do read them but bear with them. By the middle of page three it will get better.

**Assignment: As you read,** either annotate a printed copy of the article, or note in a notebook the major ways the author feels American history would have played out differently had there been no Native Americans. You should find somewhere between 8 and 10 ways.

**Assignment:** write a one-page response or reflection on the article. Since your annotation or notes takes care of "summary", please tell me about something that struck you, something new or crazy or weird, or with which you agree or disagree. What do you think of the author's arguments?
